Post Adoption Navigator Program



September has brought an exciting season of change for the HELP Post-Adoption Navigator Program (PAN) at MN ADOPT! Previously referral-based, the program is set to begin our proactive outreach to all families in Minnesota who have recently adopted from Minnesota foster care. Families will receive information and will have the opportunity to opt into receiving support within a few weeks of finalizing their adoptions.

The HELP Post-Adoption Navigator Program will be the first and only program of its kind in the state of Minnesota to have the ability to proactively reach out to all families who adopt from Minnesota foster care and help connect them with post-adoption resources as soon as possible after finalizing their adoptions. This opportunity, provided through the funding and support of the Minnesota Department of Human Services, has the potential to be a real game-changer for the children, youth, and families we serve!

What is the HELP Post-Adoption Navigator Program?

The HELP Post-Adoption Navigator Program is a free service available to any family who has adopted a child from Minnesota foster care within the past 12 months.

Families who opt into the HELP Post-Adoption Navigator Program will receive:

- A direct link to an adoption-competent professional to help respond to families' adoption-related questions and support needs;
- Periodic check-ins throughout each family's first year following finalization;
- Connections and referrals to post-adoption supportive resources;
- Topic-specific resource guides to help address families' adoption-related needs;
- A monthly newsletter featuring helpful resources, training opportunities, and family activities;
- Free or reduced registration for webinars offered through MN ADOPT.

This program is designed to meet families where they are at, and families are encouraged to engage with this program at a level that works best for them.






A book for children, adults & family members on the steps, people & emotions involved in foster care.


(For K-6)




A YA contemporary story about adoption, family, questions, and an adoptee's search for answers.
