The ICWA Kinship Program provides individualized support to Indian Child Welfare Act adoptive, foster and kinship families. We also provide support to families that are taking care of relatives through "informal" care, which usually consists of private arrangements between parents and relatives.

Permanency Support: The ICWA Kinship Worker visits with each family for barrier identification, compliance assistance, cultural support, and more. The program offers ongoing support through case management, advocacy, connections with service providers and the community. Families are able to connect with MIWRC's wrap-around in-house services.

Bi-weekly, the ICWA Kinship program offers a caregiver's group that brings together individuals and families caring for children through kinship, foster care, or informal care. This group offers families a place to embrace the traditions of preserving family and cultural ties and supporting caregivers.

Family Activities and Events: The ICWA Kinship program provides four annual family activities such as round dances, powwows, talking circles, trips to the sugar bush, and other outdoor cultural activities. The ICWA Kinship program in collaboration with other community programs hosts two annual events. These events provide families with education and training from professionals on ICWA related issues which assists families in gaining more knowledge about the Indian Child Welfare Act.
