What Adopted Children Think You Should Know

The CORE Teen videos (each 20-30 minutes in length) feature perspectives on a variety of core topics from professionals, resource parents, and young adults who have experienced foster care, kinship care, guardianship, or adoption.



The videos and discussion guides are intended for individual or group learning and are recommended for all current and prospective resource parents parenting children and youth of any age—as well as professionals who work with children, teens, and families who have experienced foster care, kinship care, guardianship, or adoption.



Transracial Adoption

Transracial adoption forever changes families and requires a commitment to lifelong learning. Prior to the placement and throughout the parenting journey, parents who have adopted transracially must commit to deepening their own understanding of

different races, cultures, and ethnicities in order to support their child or youth's exploration of race and culture. Parents should employ a variety of strategies to support healthy development for themselves and for their child. The following are examples of necessary practices:

- Understand the development of racial identity and how to proactively engage in conversations about race/ethnicity/culture and discrimination.
- Develop strategies to help prepare for and handle racism and microaggressions.
- Create opportunities for the child/youth to create relationships with role models and peers within their own race or culture.
- Commit to learning as much as possible about a child's family of origin in order to authentically integrate culturally relevant traditions, holidays, and rituals into daily home life.

Adoption has a lifelong impact on those who experience it. After an adoption is finalized, therapy can be a useful support to help adoptive families with challenges that may arise at different phases of life.

It is just one component of a range of services for adoptive families that can effectively address issues related to grief, attachment, or trauma. This factsheet provides suggestions for finding



an adoption-competent therapist and offers information about the types of therapy that can help adopted children and their families

November is such an exciting month. From Circus of the Heart, National Adoption Awareness Month, and our Education Program offering FREE webinars this month, we have a lot to celebrate.


