Minnesota establishes new Department of Children, Youth and Families



Minnesota has launched the Department of Children, Youth, and Families, aimed at enhancing support for children and families. Launched on July 1 under Commissioner Tikki Brown, this new state agency will align outcomes and policies across state government, prioritize funding needs, and focus local partners on improving access to services.

DCYF is designed to sharpen the focus of state agencies on the issues that matter most to families. By embedding a child focus within the Governor's Cabinet, the agency is positioned to provide better services statewide.

This initiative reflects a nationwide trend, as many states have reorganized to better coordinate services for children. The DCYF will include staff from the Department of Human Services' Children and Family Services, along with personnel from the Office of Inspector General and the Departments of Education, Public Safety and Health.

The goal is to create a sustainable and recognizable public face for children's issues in Minnesota, making services more accessible and effective for families.


